

# Dramatic Sky

1. Duplicate the layer in the layers palette.
2. Select the **lasso tool** from the tool bar on the left of the main screen (third from the top)
3. On the header bar that opens, you will find box called **Feather**, alongside this there is a white box. Highlight the box and type in the number **60** (this is a starting point and the can be increased or decreased as needed)
4. Now click on the sky area of your image, close to the skyline. While holding down the click loosely follow the skyline and then go around the outside edge of the image until you have returned to where you started your selection. On releasing the click you will find that there are marching ants around the selected area.
5. Now go to **select> invert**, this will change your selection to the rest of the image on the second layer. Press **delete** (Del) on your keyboard and you will see light and dark grey squares appear on the icon in the second layer in the layers palette.
6. Go to **select> deselect** on the main header bar to get rid the marching ants.
7. At the top left of the **layers palette** there is a box which says **Normal**, click this to get a dropdown menu, from this select **Multiply** and the sky in your main image should be more dramatic.
8. If this is not enough then use levels on the second layer to add drama. Or use the Digital ND Filter.
